### FACILITIES UPDATE

When the 'BEAST FROM THE EAST' with its strong winds and exceptionally low temperatures passed through Pennine Way in early March, extensive damage was caused to the structure of the club's changing rooms brought on by numerous burst water pipes.

When club members entered the changing rooms on 2 March they were greeted with an avalanche of water that was flooding the Home changing room and the Doctors' treatment room.

There were burst water pipes everywhere and after some hours, thanks to sterling work by a small team of volunteers, the problem seemed to be fixed. A week later on match day when the Commercial boiler was lit to power the 13 showers more serious leaks were discovered and the players & match officials had to go without showers.

The whole issue has raised the question of the suitability of the changing room block. The flat roof, breeze block building was originally built in 1985 as the Stags' clubhouse and converted to changing rooms in 1995 when the new clubhouse was opened.

There is evidence that the whole roof needs replacing with the patchwork repairs carried out recently not being the answer.

Given that the walls of the building are still sound, one option is to raise one side of the building and add a pitched, tiled roof which would be in harmony with the rest of the clubhouse building.

At the same time the current totally inadequate 1/2 inch mains water supply could be upgraded to a commercial supply removing the need for the 'tank room' where water for the showers and clubhouse toilets is stored.

This in turn would create space to incorporate the match officials changing room within the building and free up the portable changing room block as an additional changing room for players.

Additionally, the opportunity would exist to install much more modern showering facilities for the players

Whatever decision is made there will be significant financial implications for the club. If there are any supporters out there who can offer us technical advice on the building then we would be grateful to hear from you.
